Quilt size: $691122^{\prime \prime} \times 791 / 22^{\prime \prime}$ * Block size: 10 "

## Supply List

Fabrics (see fabric key on page 2)
Based on 44/45" 100\% cotton fabrics

- $15 / 8$ yards of fabric $A$ (brown tone-on-tone) for block $A$, block $B$ circle appliqué, and binding
- $3 / 4$ yard of fabric B (white-and-brown) for block A
- $3 / 4$ yard of fabric C (white-and-green) for block A
- $3 / 4$ yard of fabric D (green-and-white) for block A
- $11 / 8$ yards of fabric $E$ (orange dot) for block $A$ arcs
- $1 \frac{1}{8}$ yards of fabric $F$ (brown dot) for block $A$ arcs
- $7 / 8$ yard of fabric $G$ (multicolor floral) for block B
- $3 / 4$ yard of fabric H (red tone-on-tone) for block B and inner border
- $3 / 8$ yard of fabric I (green tone-on-tone) for block B
- $11 / 8$ yards of fabric J (light green dot) for block B
- 1 yard of fabric $K$ (orange floral) for outer border
- $47 / 8$ yards backing fabric


## Other Materials

- No-Melt Mylar or heat-resistant template plastic (EZ Quilting preferred)*
- Ultra-fine point Sharpie permanent marker for tracing shapes on template plastic
- Neutral thread for patchwork
- Machine needles - Microtex sharp 60/8
(preferred) or $70 / 10$ for machine appliqué
- Clear monofilament (.004) thread for appliqué **
- 60 wt thread to match background fabric
- Water-soluble fabric glue (Quilter's Choice, Glue-baste-it, or Jillily Studio appliqué glue - A glue stick is not suitable)
*Available for purchase in class
**To achieve the desired results, I use monofilament or invisible thread. However, if you do not want to use invisible thread, bring 60 wt thread that matches the $A, E, F$, and I print (or whatever colors you are using for those prints).


## General sewing supplies

- Sewing machine with blanket or zigzag stitch and open-toe embroidery presser foot**
- Rotary cutting mat, cutter and ruler (6" x 14")
- Sharp scissors for cutting fabric
- Paper scissors for cutting template plastic
- Iron and ironing board (if not provided in class)
- Thread stand (optional)
- Any other favorite tools you like to have on hand for a day of sewing
**Before class, make sure your machine is in good working order and locate the blanket stitch on your machine.


## Cutting

For class only, cut the following pieces. A
complete cutting list will be provided in class. All strips are cut across the width of fabric (wof).
From each of fabric $B$, fabric $C$, and fabric $D$, cut:

- 4 squares, 6" $\times 6$ " ( 12 total)


## From fabric A , cut:

- 4 squares, 6 " x 6 "
- Bring at least $1 / 4$ yard to class for appliqués

From fabric $\mathbf{G}$, cut:

- 1 strip, $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ wof; crosscut into 13 rectangles, 3 " $\times 5 \frac{1}{2}$ " (bring at least 8 rectangles to class)
- 1 strip, $3^{\prime \prime}$ x wof


## From fabric H , cut:

- 1 strip, $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ wof

From fabric J , cut:

- 2 strips, $5 \frac{1}{2}$ " x wof; crosscut into 14 squares, $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 2$ " (bring at least 8 squares to class)


## From fabric E :

- Bring at least $1 / 4$ yard to class for appliqués

From fabric F :

- Bring at least $1 / 4$ yard to class for appliqués


## From fabric I:

- Bring at least $1 / 8$ yard to class for appliqués


## Sewing before Class

To make half-square-triangle units, you can cut the 6 " fabric A-D squares in half diagonally. Then sew fabric A triangles to fabric B triangles and fabric C triangles to fabric $D$ triangles. Or, you can mark a draw a line from corner to corner on the wrong side of each fabric $B$ and fabric $D$ square. Layer a fabric $B$ squares right sides together with each fabric $A$ square, and stitch $1 / 4$ " on each side of the marked line. Cut the squares apart on the drawn line to make two half-square-triangle units. Press the seam allowances open. Layer the fabric $C$ and fabric $D$ squares; then sew and cut in the same way as before. Trim the units to measure $51 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ square. Make $8 \mathrm{~A} / \mathrm{B}$ units and $8 \mathrm{C} / \mathrm{D}$ units. Bring the units to class.

## Fabric Key

- Fabric A: brown tone-on-tone (blocks A and B, binding)
- Fabric B: white-and-brown print (block A)
- Fabric C: white-and-green print (block A)
- Fabric D: green-and-white print (block A)
- Fabric E: orange dot (block A appliqués)
- Fabric F: brown dot (block A appliqués)
- Fabric G: multicolor floral (block B)
- Fabric H: red tone-on-tone (block B, inner border)
- Fabric I: green tone-on-tone (block B)
- Fabric J: light green dot (block B)
- Fabric K: orange floral (outer border only - not shown below)
